Auto Jobs dot Com hires a thief

As of October 1st 2007, <http://automotivejobsonline.com/>merged with AUTOjobs.com and immediately started spamming customers of Needtechs.com requesting them to advertise with AUTOjobs.com.

AUTOjobs.com not only hired a thief, they adopted his morals. Any time they had the opportunity to talk with an advertiser on NeedTechs.com they directed them to view the web sites packed with lies that Mike Alich had published (knowing that they are lies). They have brought shame and disgrace to a once well respected web site.

They should stop pillaging NeedTechs.com's advertisers. Since 1999 not one of NeedTechs.com's employees ever contacted an advertiser on AUTOjobs.com. Further, NeedTechs.com trains its sales people to start conversations with "Have you ever advertised on the internet for technicians or other personnel".
